PREPARE A WAY FOR THE LORD

Jesus didn't just arrive in the world unannounced. God's plan of salvation unfolded over thousands of years. He revealed himself first to the Jewish people in various ways through the patriarchs and prophets and in signs and wonders.

John the Baptist is seen to be the last of the prophets and a figure that therefore connects Old and New Testaments. Matthew and Luke begin their Gospels with the Nativity. Today we hear the start of Mark's Gospel which actually begins with the figure of John the Baptist.

John pointed to a person but also pointed out to people what they should be doing. We hear that he was "...proclaiming a baptism of repentance." Despite the great crowds flocking to him to confess their sins, he said humbly, "Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals."

Just as God prepared for his Son to be born across the centuries, so we are asked to prepare ourselves humbly for Christmas, so that it can be a time of grace and blessing for us. Confession is available before both weekend Masses and that is the ideal preparation for Christmas.

Second reading: 2 Peter 3:8-14 ·

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat.
