"What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth?"

The man with the unclean spirit in today's Gospel reading asks, "What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth?" This question is one that we all might well ask. But he follows it with another question that shows how much he misunderstands Jesus: "Have you come to destroy us?"



To some extent, the prophets had already answered Jesus' first question. Micah says, "This is what the Lord asks of you: only this, to act justly, to love tenderly and to walk humbly with your God." And Hosea says, "What I want is love, not sacrifice; knowledge of God, not holocausts."

The prophet Isaiah is particularly specific. His words are especially fitting on Caritas Sunday: "Is not this the sort of fast that pleases me...to share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor."



Jesus came first and foremost to reveal the Father's love for us and to offer us salvation from sin and death and eternal happiness in heaven. In the Gospel reading, Jesus frees the man of his unclean spirit. We can only imagine how the man's life

changes after this. "Caritas" or "charity" is at the heart of our Christian call. We need to experience the love of God and then share it with others.



Come in; let us bow and bend low; let us kneel before the God who made us: for he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture, the flock that is led by his hand.



Second reading: 1 Corinthians

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

Gospel according to Mark

Jesus and his disciples went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the sabbath came he went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.
