THE CALL... TO PRAYER

Last week we heard about the call of Samuel. God called Samuel three times and each time Samuel thought that it was his teacher Eli who was calling him. Eli advised him that it must be God calling, so when Samuel heard another call, he realised it was God calling him and he finally answered, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus calls people to repent and believe the Good News. He also calls Simon and Andrew to follow. Simon and Andrew did not hesitate. Last week, I made a call for cleaning help at the end of Mass and some people came forward straight away. We are always blessed when we follow the call.



The first reading about Jonah illustrates this very well. God called Jonah and gave him a task, which was to go to the great city of Nineveh and preach to the people before the city was destroyed. Jonah was successful and the city was spared

disaster.

But we should remember what happened to Jonah when God first called him: "Jonah decided to run away from God..." So he boarded a ship for Tarshish. Jonah realised that he had been avoiding God's call, got thrown overboard the ship and then swallowed by a whale! This illustrates what can happen when we fail to follow God's call.

Pope Francis has called us all to a Year of Prayer and began the year by asking us to entrust our prayer to Mary, the Mother of God. We can't answer all the other calls God makes to us unless we answer the call to prayer, for it is through prayer itself that God makes the deepest and clearest call to us.
