BACK FROM THE DEAD

Today's Gospel reading features another Resurrection appearance of Jesus. Two of the disciples had just been telling others about how the Lord had appeared to them on the road, when, right then and there, he stood among them and said, "Peace be with you."

These disciples, we hear, were put into "a state of alarm and fright" and thought that they were seeing a ghost. I wonder if we can be harsh about the disciples' failure to recognise Jesus on some occasions after his Resurrection? They can seem slow and disbelieving and lacking in faith.

However, we need to try to put ourselves in their position. They had watched Jesus die in agony on the cross and must have been traumatised when he was pronounced dead and placed in a tomb. No wonder, then, that when some of them come face to face with him again, they react as they do.

In the homily this weekend, I am going to be speaking about lan McCormack, a man who I genuinely believe returned from the dead and underwent a Christian conversion that he has now testified to for over forty years as an evangelist. His experience really helps us to understand how Jesus' death and Resurrection offer life to us.
